Abstract

A report and maps prepared and submitted annually by Tolko Industries Limited, Norbord Inc., La Crete Sawmills Ltd., N'Deh Corporation, and Netaskinan Limited for scheduled activities during the 2018/19 timber year. The approval of the Annual Operating Plan by Alberta provides authorization for harvest, road (including watercourse crossings), and forest management activities.



INTRODUCTION

The 2018/19 Annual Operating Plan has been prepared for Forest Management Units F14, F26, P19, and P21 by Tolko Industries Ltd. (Tolko), Norbord Inc. (Norbord), La Crete Sawmills Ltd. (LCSM), N'Deh Corporation (N'Deh), and Netaskinan Limited (Netaskinan), herein referred to as the Companies. Additional Information regarding Tolko, Norbord, and LCSM can be located on the High Level Woodlands website (www.highlevelwoodlands.com).

The Annual Operating Plan consists of 10 sections which are submitted annually to Alberta Agriculture and Forestry (Alberta) throughout the timber year. The purpose of the Annual Operating Plan is to articulate in detail the activities within the timber year for Alberta to authorize harvest, roads (including watercourse crossings), and forest management activities.

The Annual Operating Plan has been prepared in accordance with applicable provincial and federal legislation including, but not limited to:

- The Forest Act
- The Water Act
- The Public Lands Act
- The Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act
- The Forest and Prairie and Protection Act
- The Fisheries Act
- The Migratory Birds Convention Act
- The Navigation Protection Act
- The Species at Risk Act

The Annual Operating Plan has utilized the Upper Hay Regional Timber Harvest Planning and Operating Ground Rules for operations within Forest Management Units F14 and F26, and the Daishowa-Marubeni International Ltd. Peace River Pulp Division FMA Operating Ground Rules for operations within Forest Management Units P19 and P21. Within the Annual Operating Plan these documents are referenced as the Operating Ground Rules.

In addition to provincial and federal legislation, the Annual Operating Plan has also been prepared in accordance with applicable:

- FMA Agreements, including the Fire Control Agreement
- Timber Quota Certificates (CTQ and DTA)
- Detailed Forest Management Plans
- Alberta Forestry Directives

This Annual Operating Plan contains text, tables, maps, and spatial data of harvest area boundaries, roads and watercourse crossings. Reasonable effort has been made to ensure the information presented in the various formats and sections of the Annual Operating Plan is consistent and correct. The Companies request Alberta's approval utilize the spatial data submitted on Alberta's FTP site as the authoritative source for harvest area boundaries, roads and watercourse crossings.
