INTRODUCTION

The 2017/18 Annual Operating Plan has been prepared for Forest Management Units F26, P19, P21 and F14 by Tolko Industries Ltd. (Tolko), Norbord Inc. (Norbord), La Crete Sawmills Ltd. (LCSM), N'Deh Corporation (N'Deh) and Netaskinan Limited (Netaskinan). The Annual Operating Plan has been prepared in accordance with applicable provincial and federal legislation including, but not limited to:

- The Forest Act
- The Water Act
- The Public Lands Act
- The Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act
- The Forest and Prairie and Protection Act
- The Migratory Birds Convention Act
- The Fisheries Act
- The Navigation Protection Act

The Annual Operating Plan has utilized the Upper Hay Regional Timber Harvest Planning and Operating Ground Rules for operations within Forest Management Units F26 and F14 and the Daishowa-Marubeni International Ltd. Peace River Pulp Division FMA Operating Ground Rules for operations within Forest Management Units P19 and P21, herein referenced as the Operating Ground Rules.

The Annual Operating Plan is made up of 10 sections that are submitted annually to Alberta Agriculture and Forestry (Alberta) throughout the timber year. The purpose of the Annual Operating Plan is to articulate in detail the activities within the timber year for Alberta to authorize harvest, roads (including watercourse crossings), and forest management activities. The Annual Operating Plan includes blocks, roads, and watercourse crossings with approved Forest Harvest Plans no greater than five years.

This Annual Operating Plan contains text, tables, maps, and spatial data of harvest area boundaries, roads and watercourse crossings. Reasonable effort has been made to ensure the information presented in the various formats is consistent and correct. The Companies request Alberta's approvals utilize the spatial data submitted as the authoritative source for harvest area boundaries, roads and watercourse crossings.
